Mark Kahrs (Jul 2016-) (Wichita) 1 Term (State House)

Todd Tiaht (Jan 2011–Jul 2016) (Wichita) – ¼ Term, 1 Term (Finished Mike Pompeo's term. Congressman (1994-2010))

Mike Pompeo (Jul 2008–Jan 2011) (Wichita) – ¾ Term (resigned after elected to Congress)

Steve Cloud (Jul 2003–Jul 2008) (Lenexa) – ¼ Term, 1 Term (finished Calvin James' term)

Calvin James (Jul 2000–Jul 2003) – ¾ Term (died in office)

Dwight Sutherland (1997–Jul 2000) - ¾ Term (Finished Mike Harris' term)

Mike Harris (Jul 1996–1997) – ¼ Term (resigned)

Jack Ranson (1987–Jul 1996) (Wichita) – ¼ Term, 2 Terms (Finished Huck Boyd's term.)

McDill "Huck" Boyd (Aug 1966–Jan 1987) (Logan) – ½ Term, 4 ¾ Terms (Finished Sam Mellinger's term. Died January 9, 1987. Governor candidate in 1960 and 1964)

Sam Mellinger (Apr 1964–Aug 1966) (Emporia) – ½ Term (State party chair (1958–1960), became National Committeeman in April 1964 after Harry Darby resigned. He died in office in August 1966.)

Harry Darby (Jun 1940–Apr 1964) (Kansas City) – 5 ¾ Terms (served as US Senator between Senator Reed's death in December 1949 and the special election in 1950.

John D. M. Hamilton (Dec 1932–Jun 1940) (Topeka) – ¼ term, 1 Term (finished David Mulvane's term, State Representative (1925-1928); Speaker of the House (1927–1928), State Party Chair (1930-1932), RNC Chair (1936–1940))

David W. Mulvane (1920–Nov 1932) (Topeka) (2nd time) – 3 1/4 terms (died November 9, 1932)

Fred Stanley (1912–1920) - 2 Term (progressive political operative)

David W. Mulvane (1900–1912) (Topeka) (1st Time) – 3 Terms (Ally of Charles Curtis and J.R. Burton, leader of the faction opposing Cy Leland)

Cy Leland, Jr. (1884–1900) (Troy) – 4 Terms (Civil War veteran, Doniphan County Commissioner (1870-1890); State Representative (1865, 1903-1908); Collector of Internal Revenue (1888-1892); State

Party Chair 1878-1880, 1894-1896); President William McKinley's western campaign manager (1896); Kansas Pension Agent (1897-1900); credited with Republican successes in the 1892 and 1894 elections; National Conventions (1876, 1884, 1888, 1892, 1896))

John A. Martin (1872–1884) (Leavenworth) (2nd time) – 3 Terms (Governor (1883–1886))

Samuel C. Pomeroy (1870–1872) – ½ Term (U.S. Senator (1860–1872))

John A. Martin (1868–1870) (Leavenworth) – ½ Term (Governor (1883–1886))

Samuel J. Crawford (1866–1868) - ½ Term

James H. Lane (1864–1866) (Leavenworth) – ½ Term (died in office, US Senator (1861–1866))

William A. Phillips (1860–1864) – 1 term

Martin Conway (1856–1860) – 1 Term (U.S. House (1861–1862))

Alicia Salisbury (Aug 2004-Aug 2008) (Topeka) – 1 term

June Cooper (Aug 2000-Aug 2004) – 1 term

Mary Alice Lair (Aug 1988-Aug 2000) (Piqua) - 3 terms (state party Chair (1982))

Marynell Reece (Aug 1975-Aug 1988) (Scandia) – ¼ Term, 3 terms (finished Beth Rodgers' term)

Beth Rodgers (Apr 1968- Aug 1975) - 1 ¾ terms (resigned when her husband became a federal judge)

Jerene Mellinger (Aug 1966 – Apr 1968) (Emporia) – ½ Term (Finished Donna Addington's term. Widow of National Committeeman Sam Mellinger)

Donna Addington (Jul 1964-Aug 1966) (Wichita) – 1 Term (resigned for personal business reasons)

Florence Emma ("F.E.") Semple (Jul 1952-Jul 1964) (Baxter Springs) – 3 Terms

Eleanor S. Harris (Jun 1936-Mar 1952) (Ottawa) – 4 Terms (widow of newspaper publisher Ralph A. Harris. She died in office)

Elizabeth Bittman (Jun 1924-Jun 1936) (Independence) – 3 Terms
